## \$6.85 Million Funding announced

On the 26th March, Nationals Senator Steve Martin, Nationals Federal candidate for Bass Carl Cooper and Liberal Federal candidate for Bass Bridget Archer, announced a total of \$6.85 million to fund the construction of the George Town Mountain Bike Trail and the redevelopment of Regent Square in George Town.

The \$4.4 million George Town Mountain Bike Trail will comprise a trail network approximately 105 kilometres in length located at Mount George. Aimed at capturing the growing market of mountain bike trail enthusiasts, the project involves multiple trails that have been designed to accommodate users of various experience levels.

The \$2.45 million Regent Square redevelopment project aims to further activate the centrally located open space in the heart of George Town through the provision of purpose designed play equipment for various age groups, concrete pathways, park furniture, landscaping, plaza areas, signage celebrating the heritage of the square and a showpiece entrance feature.

Council had been advocating for both projects as a key strategic priority with Mayor Archer welcoming the funding saying "there has been strong community support for both projects to occur, this is why Council resolved to pursue funding for both projects as its number one priority".

Economic benefits are estimated to be upwards of \$12 million to the region stemming from the mountain bike trail alone, with Mayor Archer adding "the real value in these projects is in the physical and mental health benefits gained through providing spaces for social interaction and opportunities for low cost activity".

Mayor Archer also acknowledged "the support of the George Town Destination Action Plan leadership group and in particularly the George Town Chamber of Commerce who have been persistently advocating for these projects".

"The funds are to be provided from the commonwealth 2018/2019 budget and do not form part of any election promise which makes this announcement so exciting, as Council can continue to lobby for election commitments for a number of important projects that will require external funding to proceed" added Mayor Archer.

#### This has proven to be a very exciting month for the George Town area.

At the March Council meeting a development application was approved for a new rotary peel veneer mill at Bell Bay, with the potential to deliver around 110 local jobs. It is a very welcome addition to the local economy.

Speaking of jobs, we know that whilst many industries in our area have many employment opportunities, they often struggle to find suitable and/or skilled employees but paradoxically there are young people looking for work. The newly launched KEEN Partners here in George Town is aiming to bridge that gap in an innovative way. This is an exciting start up in our area, and I encourage you to drop into to the newly refurbished space in Macquarie Street to learn more.

In late March, Council was successful in securing \$6.85million dollars in Federal government funding to deliver two fantastic projects in our area - \$4.4million to fully fund over 100km of mountain bike trail network and the \$2.45million dollar redevelopment of Regent Square.

These two projects are considered to be of high strategic importance by Council and because of the high expenditure required are reliant on external funding to be able to proceed. Both projects immediately will be significant for the area. I would like to take the opportunity to thank the people that have been persistent advocates for these projects including George Town Chamber of Commerce, Destination Action Plan Leadership group, Regent Square Reference group and the many individuals that have championed our area and continue to do so.

## Council Community Assistance Program

Round 2 of Council's Community Assistance Grants saw four grants totalling \$4,896 awarded. Congratulations to the following recipients.

- Port Dalrymple School
   \$2,000 to assist with costs associated with their 2019
   Musical Production "Getting to Know Footloose".
- Lions Club of George Town
   \$928 to assist with costs associated with the Associations' 2019 Country Music Festival to be held in May.
- Bass Coastal Physiotheraphy
   \$468 for the purchase of Theraband Resistance Bands for use at Senior exercise classes.
- Collective ed. George Town (Beacon Foundation) \$1,500 for part costs of a shared data and measurement system to build baseline data to support large-scale community impact.

The Lulworth community extend their thanks to the George Town Safety Committee for not just making our community safer, but also the greater George Town Council region.





## Levelling the Playing Fields Grant - Sports Complex Upgrade

In 2018, the State Government announced an investment of \$10M over two years for the Levelling the Playing Field Grants Program designed at upgrading sports facilities to better accommodate girls and women.

Council has been successful in its application to the program to construct modern, all abilities accessible and equitable toilet, shower and change-room facilities for use by sporting clubs and their visitors, as well as events at the George Town Sports Complex. Planning is underway with works anticipated to commence in the second half of 2019.

## Temporary Food Licence

Did you know that if you are selling food, either at a Council owned facility, or privately owned property, you are required to have a valid food licence, and notify Council of your intent to sell food.

If you are planning to operate a temporary food stall, we recommend you contact Council's Environmental Health Officer (EHO), as you may need to register. While the temporary nature of an event means you don't have to meet all the legal requirements, certain minimum requirements are still necessary.

This is to ensure Tasmanians are eating food that has been safely stored, prepared, cooked and served.

Council's Temporary Food Standards guide has been developed for individuals, businesses, charities and community organisations that operate temporary food stalls. It clearly sets out what you have to do to comply with the Food Act 2003 and the relevant provisions of the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code, a copy of which can be found on Council's website.

#### What is a Temporary Food Stall?

A temporary food stall is a temporary arrangement of equipment and appliances from which food is sold, and which is set up for a specific, occasional event lasting no more than 10 consecutive days. A stall may be a booth, tent, marquee or other temporary equipment. It may also be a fundraising barbecue or stall that operates from an existing building, such as community centre or hall. It is essential that all event organiser liaise with Council's EHO for compliance information.

There will not be any restricted access to the walking path or surrounds while these works are completed.

TasWater will keep the community informed when the major works are rescheduled.

## VENEER, PLYWOOD AND WOODCHIP MILL **APPROVED**

The George Town Council has approved the planning application for a veneer, plywood and woodchip mill to be built at Bell Bay.

The \$54 million mill will be built on an existing industrial site at 17 Bell Bay Road, with modifications being added to the site including log cutting lines, a shredder, rotary peeling lathes and wood chipper.

The building of the mill has also been approved by the Environmental Protection Authority of Tasmania.

The mill is expected to produce about 80,000 tonnes of wood chips and 93,000 cubic metres of veneer and plywood



## Students learn of George Town's role in 'global' companies

Ben Bowring, lead of skills organisation, Collective ed, George Town, has indicated that 30% of young people in George Town are unemployed, compared to 16% statewide.

Ben is working to connect the region's young people with the many businesses in George Town. On Thursday 28th March, Ben hosted a careers opportunity panel discussion between Bell Bay Advanced Manufacturing Zone businesses and Port Dalrymple high school students.

Ben said that many Bell Bay manufacturers are crying out for more workers, and with new businesses such as the proposed Patriarch and Sons timber mill, there will be an increase in demand.

Yesterday, representatives from Bell Bay Aluminium, South32 Temco, Timberlink, Forico, Kempe Engineering, and CAD Project Engineering attended a forum, and answered the students' questions about job opportunities which are right on their doorstep. KEEN (Key Employment and Education Network) Partners is the project of respected businessman Ray Mostogl, and other business leaders of the Bell Bay Advanced Manufacturing Zone.

The students were made aware of how much global exposure these local companies have, and that you only have to drive five minutes down the road and pick up a job there and you're part of a global company.




