

Cr Greg Kieser was the successful candidate at the George Town Council Mayor by-election. Peter Parkes was also successful, he will be replacing the vacant Councillor position that was created when incumbent Cr Bridget Archer resigned to take up office as Federal Member for Bass.

Cr Kieser acknowledged Cr Tim Harris and Cr Chris Barraclough in their campaigns for mayor adding "both Cr Harris and Cr Barraclough are passionate about their local communities, I commend them on their efforts and look forward to working with them and all Councillors as a team united in delivering a positive future for our community"

It was very pleasing to see eleven candidates vying for the vacant councillor position also. I am keen to ensure that Council and staff as a collective. enhance its engagement with stakeholders. I am pleased to announce that a draft of Council's first Community Consultation Framework will be published for public comment later this month, however I trust the community is already seeing a higher level of engagement through its in involvement on projects such as the Regent Square Redevelopment. I would like to thank all of you who contribute to the consultation process and take this opportunity to recognise the work of the Regent Square Reference Group in developing the draft Regent Square Master Plan to date.

Later this month Council will look to endorse it's 2019/2020 Annual Plan which contains a number of key strategic objectives to be accomplished over the ensuing 12 months that I look forward to announcing over the coming weeks. Supported by a budget of approximately \$12M, the Annual Plan will be delivered and still achieve an end of year surplus in the order of approximately \$100k. Perhaps the project I'm most excited about is the construction of the George Town Mountain Bike Trail. Pending receipt of funding from the Commonwealth, which I'm confident will not be too far away, the community can expect to receive regular updates from myself, Council and staff on the progress of what will be an amazing asset for our community and visitors alike.

I thank you for your support and look forward to a prosperous future for our municipality

FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Frosty mornings have generally been followed by sunny days and chilly nights perfect for outdoor activities and relaxing by the fire at night. When our kids aren't engaged in local sports or other activities we have explored the landscapes and local environment by strolling along the beach, bushwalking and fishing and of course viewing the penguins which is obligatory to newcomers and visitors alike. My family and I have visited most of our rural hamlets including Bell Buoy Beach, Lulworth, Beechford, Weymouth, Bellingham, Pipers River, Hillwood and Lefroy, and are genuinely amazed at the distinct offerings of each of these picturesque communities. We really do have some hidden treasures.

On the work front, it has been an action packed few months since I last wrote in the Community Newsletter. We have seen the appointment of Cr Greg Kieser to mayor and the return of Cr Peter Parkes following the by-election, which was triggered by the resignation as mayor and councillor from Bridget Archer who successfully contested the seat of Bass in the recent federal elections. I thank Bridget for her guidance and leadership during her time as mayor and am confident that she will continue to deliver great outcomes for our region in her new capacity.

Since I last wrote, we have welcomed Meagan Bennet and Brent Daire to the organisation taking up two new key roles being the Marketing and Engagement Business Partner and People and Performance Business Partner respectively. Both Meagan and Brent come well qualified and experienced.

Meagan holds a Bachelor of Business in Applied Economics & Marketing and an Executive Certificate in Event Management. Meagan's extensive body of work has been recognised through multiple awards across a variety industries including advertising, marketing, television and event management. Meagan has held senior management roles at Woolworths, Gunns Retail, Win Television, AT&M Advertising, St Michaels Association, Walker Designs and the highly successful Festivale.

Brent was a Cardon International Scholar at the Romney Institute of Public Service and Ethics and holds a number of qualifications including Master of Public Administration, Master of Arts in Strategy & Management, Graduate Certificate in Business and a Diploma of Military Leadership. Brent has held a number of senior roles in

Australia and abroad including in the Australian Army, Melbourne Mission, Brigham University (USA), Multi-Cap Tasmania and Cornerstone Youth Services. Brent is also a George Town resident who actively participates in a number of community groups.

Through the appointment of these two roles the community can expect to see a greater media profile of Council and the municipality, greater community engagement and further transparency on organisational performance and compliance.

I am also pleased to welcome another local resident to the organisation who we have engaged through local employment agency KEEN Partners as a Horticultural trainee.

I thank the community in participating in the budget process with many of the numerous submissions having been adopted by Council. Residents will already note improvements to our streetscapes through the planting of avenue trees along Macquarie Street, which together with the appointment of a trainee was an initiative of the 2019/2020 budget.

The 2019/2020 year will certainly be a challenging one with so much to deliver. I am however confident that we will deliver on an ambitious capital works program which includes significant works at the Hillwood and George Town sports facilities, the replacement of Back Creek Bridge, the upgrade of Dalrymple Road Bridge (East Arm section), continued accessibility improvements to Council buildings and funding pending, the commencement of the mountain bike trail and the Regent Square Redevelopment which will see stage two of the playground installations and more. And I thank in advance all those who have or will contribute to draft Regent Square Master Plan and in particular I thank the tireless

efforts of the Regent Square Reference Group who have developed the draft to date.

The months ahead also see the development of a number of key strategies including municipal branding, collation of our cultural, natural and heritage assets, development of the George Town Precinct Structure Plan, review of the Hillwood Structure Plan and the development of concept plans for the Macquarie Street precinct and the former Surf Life Saving Club site at East Beach, to name a few

In discussing budgets and challenges it would be remiss not to acknowledge the financial assistance Council receives through recurrent and non-recurrent grants from both the federal and state governments. Without this assistance councils across Australia would not be able to deliver the numerous services they do for their communities.

One of the many services in which George Town Council provides is Building Services. Residents and builders will have seen recent media on the closure of Launceston based building surveying service providers. We encourage anyone affected to contact our building services team to determine if Council can assist to ensure your build is not delayed.

Finally, I take this opportunity to acknowledge the extraordinary efforts of our staff who continue to serve with a genuine commitment to ensure a greater quality of life for the people of our community. Our team continues to explore ways in which it can deliver quality services in the most efficient means that meet or exceed customer expectations. As we embark on a year that aims to deliver a surplus of approximately \$100k, it is worthy of mention that Council delivered its 2018/2019 programs achieving a surplus of approximately \$400k. My appreciation goes out to all the current and former staff who made this achievement possible. Outstanding effort!

Building Surveying Firm Closes The impact on local property owners and builders

The recent closure of a local northern building surveying company has resulted in some owners and builders of current building projects finding themselves without a building surveyor at short notice.

Most of these jobs have now been sorted, thanks to the efforts of staff from the closing company, other building surveyors, Council's Permit Authority staff, property owners and their builders.

If you have not yet appointed a new building surveyor for your works – now is the time to contact either a building surveyor or **Council Permit Authority staff** to arrange an appointment. If you have been affected by these circumstances you should have received documentation from both the company in question , and Council's Permit Authority.

New Bridge for Weymouth Farm Road



A new concrete bridge for Weymouth Farm Road given a successful grant application under the Federal Government's Timber Bridge Renewal Program 2019/2020.

Earlier this year Council submitted an application for a grant to upgrade the bridge as the existing structure has been steadily approaching the need of an upgrade. Council will be receiving \$105,000 from the Federal Government, whilst the total project will cost \$210,000, with Council funding the balance.

The exiting timber bridge will be replaced with a new concrete structure, with works scheduled to commence in the latter months of this year.

Words On Waste

Council will continue to explore all options for a viable and sustainable waste minimisation program and has recently implemented a number of initiatives at George Town waste transfer station to assist with the separation of recyclable waste products.

Some of the waste transfer charges have been reduced with other items now attracting no fee as part of a review in the 2019/20 budget process.

Council is pleased to announce an addition to its fleet, a new garbage truck to service retail and open space areas. We will be conducting a competition to create a design for the barrel of the truck in the coming months. Make sure you *Follow us on Facebook* for all the details.

Applications are now open for Resource Recovery and Waste Minimisation Grants Program. With \$70,000 allocated to the 2019/20 Round.

The NTWMG Resource Recovery and Waste Minimisation Grants Program will allocate funds to eligible organisations in Northern Tasmania that are working towards decreasing the amount of waste sent to landfill

Roads

Dalrymple Road

The re-construction of the South of East Arm Road section has been completed.

Design plans are currently underway to replace and upgrade the bridge from single to dual lanes.

The proposed completion is Jan-Feb 2020

Hillwood & Leam Roads Upgrades

A section of Hillwood and Leam Roads has been completed. Currently planning has been undertaken to continue re-construction works on Hillwood Road towards the Berry Farm.

Gerzallia Drive

Re-construction works will commence prior to December 2019

Franklin Street

The re-surfacing works are 95% complete.

The roundabout works are underway and expected to be completed in October 2019.

Industry Road

The re-construction works are 95% complete.

Design plans near completion $\;$ to widen the two single lane bridges to dual lanes.

Parks & Open Spaces

Windmill Point BBQ Area & toilet

Since the completion of the BBQ area and toilet we have noticed that this area has been well utilised and serving as a valuable asset to our community.

George Town Sports Complex

Currently possibilities are being explored in relation to the construction of new male and female toilet and shower facilities under the State Government funding agreement for Leveling of the Playing Fields.

Council will be preparing and coordinating the installation of an inground automated irrigation system in the the current 2019/20 fiscal year.

Hillwood Oval

As per the Council's 2019/20 budget the substandard boundary fence at the Hillwood oval will be replaced for the full perimeter to align with current AFL standards. It is due for completion by December 2019.





Regent Square Playground
