I love going for a walk (and a run). I especially love having a run. When I am running I can follow all the smells and scents of other dogs and animals. These take me off in all kinds of direction just following my nose. Perfect freedom. Sometimes these scents lead me to the animals and birds that left them. I understand that we have to act in accordance with the DOG CONTROL ACT 2000, the DOG CONTROL REGULATIONS 2010, the POLICE OFFENCES ACT 1935, the LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1993, and a special one for guide and hearing dogs called the GUIDE DOGS AND HEARING DOGS ACT 1967, as well as a thing called the DOG MANAGEMENT POLICY of Council.
