Drought Relief Program

Tasmanian farmers and primary producers will have more time to access financial assistance after the Tasmanian Government has extended the grant program.

In recognition of the extended dry seasonal conditions now impacting a large portion of the state, the Tasmanian Government extends support to farmers on mainland Tasmania with the opening of this scheme - the Mainland Tasmania – Livestock Producers – Seasonal Conditions Scheme.

This scheme will provide one-off payments of up to \$5,000 to eligible farm businesses.

To be eligible, farm businesses will need

Every year, approximately 1,200 people are killed and another 40,000+ are seriously injured on Australian roads. Traffic injury is the biggest killer of Australian children under 15 and the second-biggest killer of all Australians aged between 15 and 24. Service providers included Outer Cove Creative Inc with a paint throwing installation, cartooning by Ben, a photo booth, and a large number of bean bags supplied by City of Launceston.
