Kennel Licence – Information Sheet

Do you keep more than 2 dogs on your property or more than 4 workings dogs over the age of 6 months? If you do you will need to have a licence to keep several dogs.

To get a licence you will have to follow this procedure:

1. Fill out the Notice of Intention to Apply for a Licence for keeping several dogs
2. You must then have the completed form published in the Public Notices section of The Examiner newspaper.
3. Fill out your Application for a Licence (Keeping of Several Dogs).
4. Cut out your advertisement from The Examiner, along with the date.
5. Send your completed Application for a Licence to:

Don't forget to include your advertisement and your application fee of:

- \$97.00 for 3-5 dogs
- \$31.00 Renewal
- \$142.00 for 6 or more dogs
- \$31.00 Renewal

We will write to you within 28 days after your application is received to let you know whether or not you were successful.

Please note:

- Applying for a licence does not guarantee you will get one. We will take into account:
 - Objections from residents living within 200 metres.
 - Any history of official complaints about nuisance dogs.
 - After the required 14-day objection period a property Inspection will be carried out.
- If you are refused a licence you have the right to appeal before a magistrate at the Court of Petty Sessions.
- You do not necessarily have to own all the dogs. If all the dogs are kept on one property then a licence is required.
- Licences run out on 30 June each year. The renewal fees are as stated above.
- The penalty for not having a licence is \$205.00 on the spot fine.
- Maximum fine if prosecuted for not having a licence is \$1025.00.
